# LIMERICK TOWNSHIP - BOARD OF SUPERVISORS PUBLIC MEETING MINUTES

APRIL 17, 2018 7:02 P.M.

A meeting of the Limerick Township Board of Supervisors was held on Tuesday, April 17, 2018, in the Public Meeting Room of the Temporary Limerick Township Municipal Building located at 155 S. Limerick Road with D. Elaine DeWan, Chairman, presiding. This meeting was advertised in The Mercury on January 6, 2018.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING #1**

Ordinance No. 386 – Rezone #17-01, 614 W. Ridge Pike & 1109 Four Maples Court: Ms. Kearney suspended the Regular Meeting. She presented exhibits for incorporation into the record and proceeded with the Hearing for Ordinance No. 386. A Court Reporter was present and the Notes of Testimony will be available at the Township Building for review. The applicant, Mr. Joseph Gambone and his planner, Mr. John Kennedy, summarized the request for the rezoning of certain parcels and the proposal of additional apartment buildings for the Board. Ms. Kearney asked for questions or comments from the Board. Ms. Shuler inquired of the impact of the rezoning in regard to uses, standards, etc. At the conclusion, Ms. Kearney opened the floor for public comment. Mr. Stephen Conrad, owner of a property at 628 W. Ridge Pike, expressed his support of the project. Upon the completion of the public comments she adjourned the Public Hearing and moved back into the Public Meeting. The Hearing was properly advertised and properly conducted.

**Motion was made** by Mr. Neafcy, and seconded by Ms. Shuler, to approve Ordinance No. 386, rezoning 614 W. Ridge Pike and 1109 Four Maples Court. Motion passed unanimously.

# **PUBLIC HEARING #2**

Ordinance No. 387 – Rezone #17-02, Railroad and Main Streets, Linfield: Ms. Kearney suspended the Regular Meeting. She presented exhibits for incorporation into the record and proceeded with the Hearing for Ordinance No. 387. A Court Reporter was present and the Notes of Testimony will be available at the Township Building for review. Ms. Greta Martin Washington summarized the proposed rezoning for the Board. Ms. Kearney asked for questions or comments from the Board. Hearing none, she opened the floor for public comment. Mr. Bruce Shaw (46 Railroad Street), expressed his concern of parking that a rezone may produce. Ms. Martin Washington answered his question by explaining the parking study that the Township performs on every new use application. Upon the completion of the public comments Ms. Kearney adjourned the Public Hearing and moved back into the Public Meeting. The Hearing was properly advertised and properly conducted.

**Motion was made** by Mr. Neafcy, and seconded by Ms. Shuler, to approve Ordinance No. 387, rezoning portions of Railroad Street and Main Street, Linfield. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING #3**

<u>Ordinance No. 388 – Rezone #17-03, Zoning Map Corrections</u>: Ms. Kearney suspended the Regular Meeting. She presented exhibits for incorporation into the record and proceeded with the Hearing for Ordinance No. 388. A Court Reporter was present and the Notes of Testimony will be available at the Township Building for review. Ms. Greta Martin Washington summarized the zoning map corrections for the Board. Ms. Kearney asked for questions or

comments from the Board. Hearing none, she opened the floor for public comment. Mr. Ronald Dinnocenti, owner of 1152 Main Street, inquired of the rezoning of his parcel. Upon the completion of the public comments Ms. Kearney adjourned the Public Hearing and moved back into the Public Meeting. The Hearing was properly advertised and properly conducted.

**Motion was made** by Mr. Sperring, and seconded by Mr. Neafcy, to approve Ordinance No. 388, correcting the Zoning Map. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **Confirmed Appointments**

<u>RCLD LP by RCLD General – 1 & 15 Neiffer Road</u>: The applicant, Mr. Gary Bolis Jr., and the project engineer, Mr. John Gallagher, summarized the plan to construct a mixed use of commercial buildings and townhomes at the intersection of Ridge Pike and Neiffer Road. Discussions ensued regarding the proposed commercial uses, intersection signalization of Ridge Pike and Neiffer Road, buffering, and entrances onto Neiffer Road. The Board expressed their favor in the proposal.

<u>Pike Salvage – 412 Swamp Pike</u>: The applicant's attorney, Mr. Albert DeGennaro, summarized his client's intent for installing a sign at their salvage operation at 412 Swamp Pike. Members of the Board expressed their concern that the applicant installed the sign without a permit. Discussion ensued regarding the history of the sign and the Township sign ordinance. The Board directed Township staff to begin to work on a revision to the existing sign ordinance to include commercial signage in residential districts. The Board also expressed their understanding that a continuance of the Zoning Hearing Board appeal (#18-03), submitted by Pike Salvage Realty, LLC, until a decision is rendered by the Supervisors on a revised zoning ordinance, will permit the existing sign to remain on the property until the zoning appeal is concluded by the Zoning Hearing Board.

The Township Engineer would need to perform tasks 3 and 4 of the overall process, which includes traffic data collection and firming up a design of the intersection realignment.

**Motion was made** by Ms. Shuler, and seconded by Mr. Sperring, to approve Royersford Rd/Linfield Trappe Intersection design costs for Tasks 3 and 4 for an amount not to exceed \$18,000.00. Motion passed unanimously.

<u>Discussion/Approval – Lennar Pump & Haul Agreement</u>: Mr. Kerr briefly summarized the agreement.

**Motion was made** by Ms. Shuler, and seconded by Mr. Sperring, to approve the Lennar Pump and Haul Agreement. Motion passed unanimously.

<u>Authorization – Special Fire Police</u>: The Township received a request for the services of the Limerick Township Special Fire Police at an event that occurred on Saturday, April 14<sup>th</sup>.

**Motion was made** by Ms. Shuler, and seconded by Mr. Sperring, to approve the use of the Limerick Township Special Fire Police for a fund-raising event on Saturday, April 14th. Motion passed unanimously.

<u>Authorization – Sale of 2007 John Deere Tractor w/ Attachments</u>: Mr. Kerr summarized that the top bid result came in 25,000 dollars above what was proposed in the 2018 budget.

**Motion was made** by Mr. Sperring, and seconded by Ms. Shuler, to approve the sale of the 2007 John Deere tractor with attachments in the amount of \$55,300.00. Motion passed unanimously.

<u>Supervisor Comments</u>: Mr. Neafcy expressed his desire to see the Township continue to hold the Ridgeview Terrace management company to firm dates, to ensure continued progress.
