Message from the Chairman

We congratulate Limerick Fire Company on the completion of their new facility highlighted in this newsletter. More importantly, we thank all of our fire service volunteers for their dedication to our community. At any hour of the day and no matter the weather conditions, our dedicated volunteers answer the call for service. The volume of calls has risen steadily over the past decade to approximately 700 calls per year. Over the past five years, in cooperation with the fire service, the Township has discussed and implemented solutions to the increasing demands on the volunteers. These increased demands have placed a strain on current and future membership. With a volunteer structure which saves this community over \$4 million annually, the Board recognized that added support was essential.

Key long range planning objectives identified the need for modern equipment and facilities so our volunteers can focus on their core responsibility of providing emergency response services. The new Limerick Fire Company facility, similar to the former 1984 station that it replaces, is designed to serve this community for the next 30+ years. The new station also provides adequate space to house Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and the needs of the Township's Emergency Operations Center. The decision to construct a new facility was made after estimates demonstrated a savings of \$1 million dollars in comparison to the cost of renovating the old outdated facility. This cost savings is important as it helped to limit the burden on the taxpayers of this community and maintain real estate tax rates in the lower half when compared to the 62 municipalities within Montgomery County.

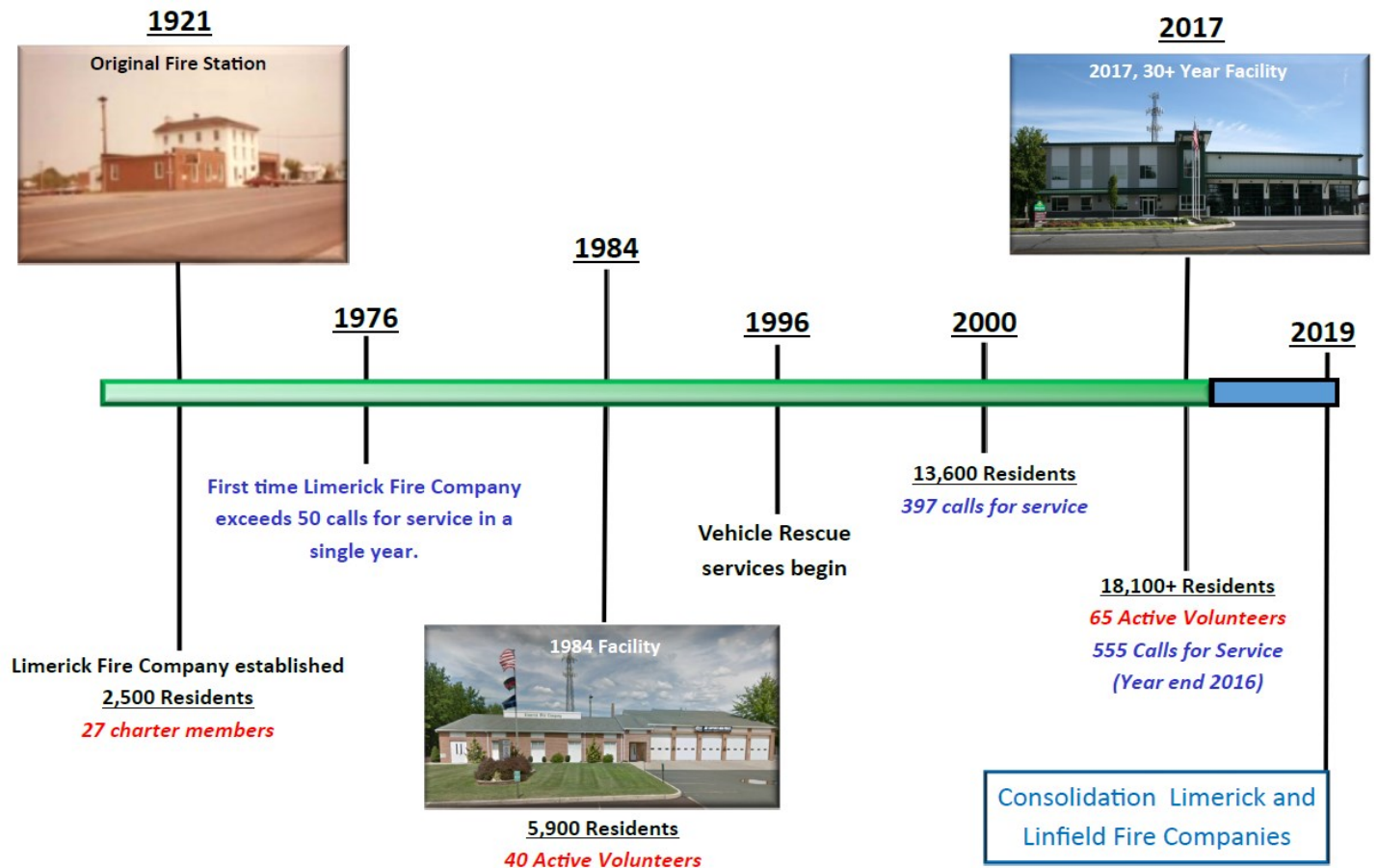
The Township is also excited to announce another positive endeavor under way which will reshape the structure of our two volunteer fire companies. Recently, the full membership of both Linfield and Limerick Fire Companies voted to move forward on a consolidation of their operations. Scheduled to be completed by January 2019, the consolidation will provide greater economies of scale and help stabilize the tax burden of providing emergency fire and rescue services. The Board is confident the volunteer fire service structure, which has served the Township for over 100 years, will become stronger and continue to protect this wonderful Limerick community for many years by working together as one team.

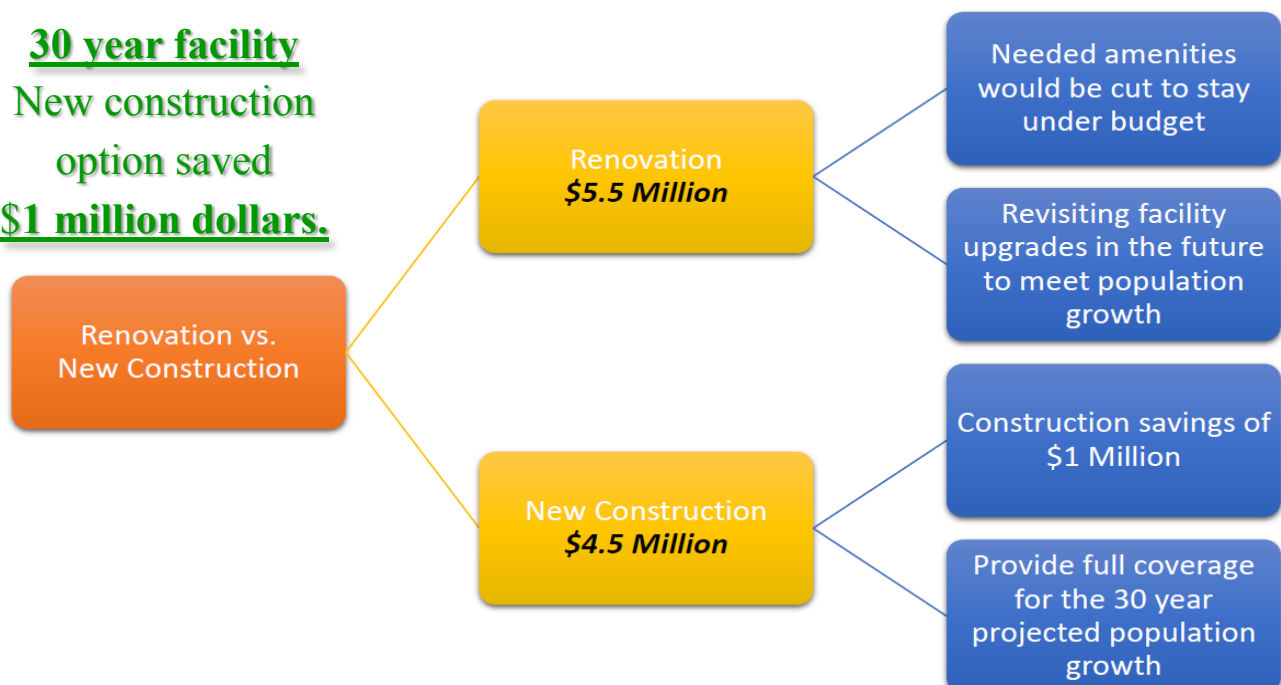

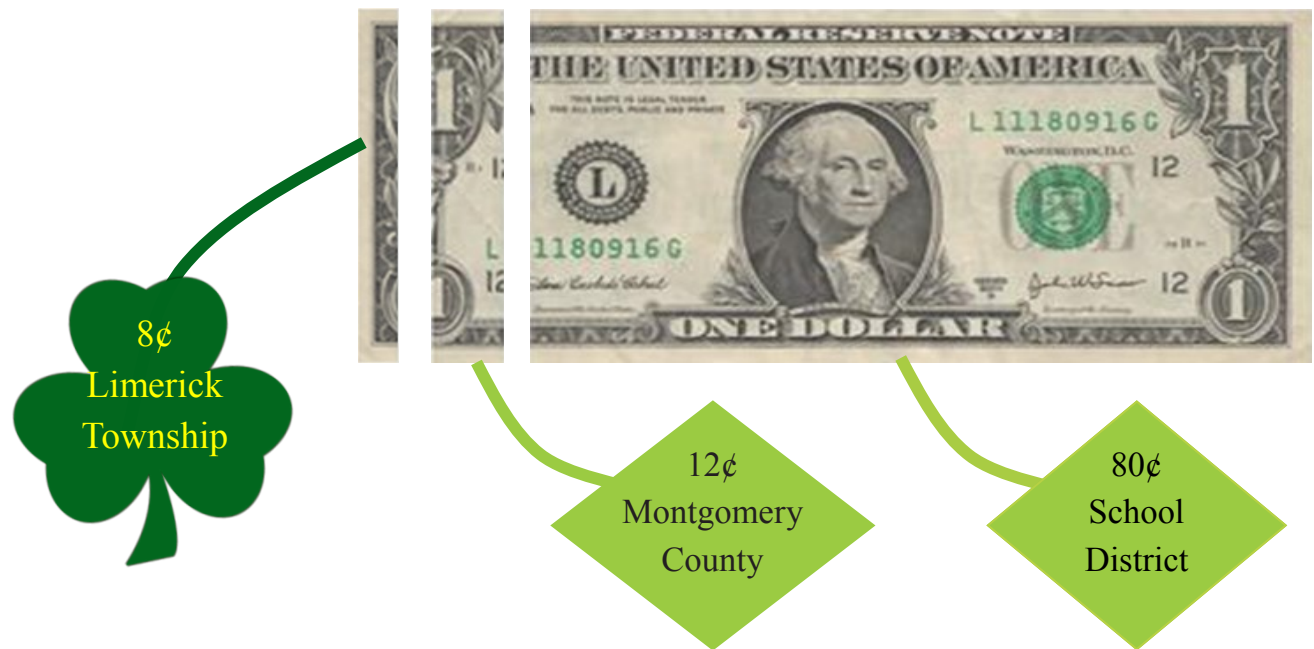

Lieutenant Promotion

On June 20, 2017, the Limerick Township Board of Supervisors promoted Sergeant Robert J. Matalavage to Lieutenant in the Limerick Township Police Department. Lieutenant Matalavage has been serving the Limerick Township community for the last 30 years.

In July of 1990, Bob became the first K-9 officer in the history of our Department, starting the unit with K-9 Bandit. After Bandit's retirement he went on to continue K-9 service with K-9 Jago, until Jago's retirement in December 2008. In total Bob served 18 years as a K-9 Officer. During that time he received numerous Commendations for K-9 apprehensions and drug seizures. In October of 1997, Bob was promoted to Corporal and in September of 2007, he was promoted to Sergeant thus serving as a supervisor for a total of 20 years. During his career, he has served the Department as a Field Training Officer and a Firearms Instructor. Along with his numerous K-9 Commendations, Bob has also been the recipient of multiple Commendations for life saving and high profile arrests.

Bob attended the Penn State Posit and Porex classes and most recently he attended the FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development course, earning its Prestigious Trilogy Award for completing the Association's top three training courses.

Bob is married to his beautiful wife Cecilia of twenty years and has two step children, Rob and Brittany. Rob is following in Bob's footsteps as a police officer in Hampton, Virginia. Cecilia and Bob also have 2 beautiful granddaughters, Sophia and Elleanna.

Tips for our Residents to Protect the Environment

- ♦ **Limit your use of lawn fertilizers, herbicides, and insecticides**
Reduce the size of your lawn by creating beds of shrubs and perennials. These landscape beds allow water to penetrate the soil and recharge groundwater. You can also reduce your need for herbicides by mowing your grass at 3 to 4 inches
- ♦ **Take a soil test to determine what nutrients your plants need**
Soil tests determine what nutrients your plants need. Plants and lawns may not require as much fertilizer as you think
- ♦ **Use natural fertilizers and time it right**
Use compost or slow release fertilizer on lawn areas. Leave grass clippings on your lawn to compost naturally. Avoid fertilizing your lawn before a heavy rain to prevent runoff of excess fertilizer
- ♦ **Skip the pavement and use permeable hardscaping like wood, stone or paving blocks**
Permeable hardscaping helps prevent runoff by allowing water to soak into the ground
- ♦ **Plant trees**
Trees help in reducing the amount of runoff entering the storm drains
- ♦ **Water wisely**
Plant your garden when less water is needed
